has digested its sample, and it tastes like chicken is similar to what's found on slopes of Mauna Kea.

Registrar Michelle announced no guests tonight.

Sunday, we had a private gathering, and one person counts as a guest because he joined. Gary Sanders, encouraged to visit by Marcia Minsky, works for the Post Office. He joined so he could have access to the library and hang with authors. No word on whether he beat The Emperor's record for time elapsed between learning about the club and joining it.

Michelle changed hats to Christian to run the auction. We have three packets of coffee, limited edition, a CD, and a poster. The Emergency Holographic Scribe bought the CD. Keep those bits and bytes coming!

Marty Cantor: one could go on forever with stories, like the time he went house hunting with Marilyn Monroe. He had lots of talents -- crafting including soft core porn. He was doing photos with Bill Warren for a French publication. As for cartooning -- on occasion, Marty would need covers for LASFAPA and Bill would draw a cover while talking to people nonstop, interrupting only to hand the completed cover to Marty. The Emperor: Rotsler was a jack of some trades, and an ace of the rest. The Warren Project was a TV program for French TV. Charlie took over for Rotsler just before they canceled the show. Rotsler had a long career making movies of all types. There is a collection of movies where the budget for women's clothing is very limited, available for viewing under special circumstances. He did lots of things and enjoyed doing them all. He kept an eye on a lot of women, knew one who was fairly petite. Was puzzled when she told him she played the dragon lady in Terry and the Pirates. Then she drew up to full height, said "you're dead, mister", and was quite convincing.

Milt Stevens recalled a breakfast where Harlan Ellison complained his fried eggs were staring at him. Rotsler drew a face on the eggs. Someone passing by grabbed the plate, took it to art show, and it was sold for \$15. That's what happens when you play with someone else's food. Matthew: Many have spoken about Rotsler's art. If you want to be an artist like him, get a pen and paper and draw everything you see for 20 years. After his death, people looked at his computer and learned he was teaching himself computer assisted art. He turned to writing, including "Patron of the Arts", which won a Hugo and was nominated for a Nebula.

He is missed. **Patron Saint Bill Rotsler** was given Three Cheers he could hear wherever he happened to be, even if only in the urn in the next room. And everything, so he can draw it.

Essential appointed **Committee Reports:** The Autumn Holiday party was a success.
