Curiosity has failed to detect any methane in the Martian atmosphere, which confirms some earlier findings and casts doubt on whether Mars ever fostered microbial life. Meanwhile, by re-analyzing some old data, an international team of scientists have detected three more planets around dwarf star HD 40307, roughly 42 light years away. This makes a grand total of six, but the inner five are clustered closer to that star than Mercury is to our sun. The sixth planet is several times the mass of Earth, but resides in the "habitable zone." This means it might actually be far enough away from its parent star to have liquid water and a solid day/night rotation.

Astronomers have also discovered an orphan planet that has no parent star! It's four to seven times the size of Jupiter, and free-floating about 130 light years away. It's actually considered a very small brown dwarf star, a gas giant that lacked sufficient mass to ignite. This might be fairly common, but it's hard to say since brown dwarves don't produce visible light and are therefore hard for us to detect.

Marty added some science of his own, by way of a friend in Long Island, braving a blackout. He drives a Prius... which he has wired up to his heating, wifi, kitchen light, and charger so he can sit comfortably in a warm kitchen and get online, all thanks to his car!
