

Just wanted to say thank you for all you do in getting LASFS news to those of us in the hinterlands. You are much appreciated.


Congrats on your Evans-Freehafer award. It's always gratifying to get accolades from your peers.

BOARD GAMING MEETUP


The board gaming Meetup which had been meeting at LASFS on Friday Nights has moved to a temporary venue, a game store in Sherman Oaks.
