After giving potential nominations a last chance, the nominations were closed. Chances are, the election of Board members will be very short next week.

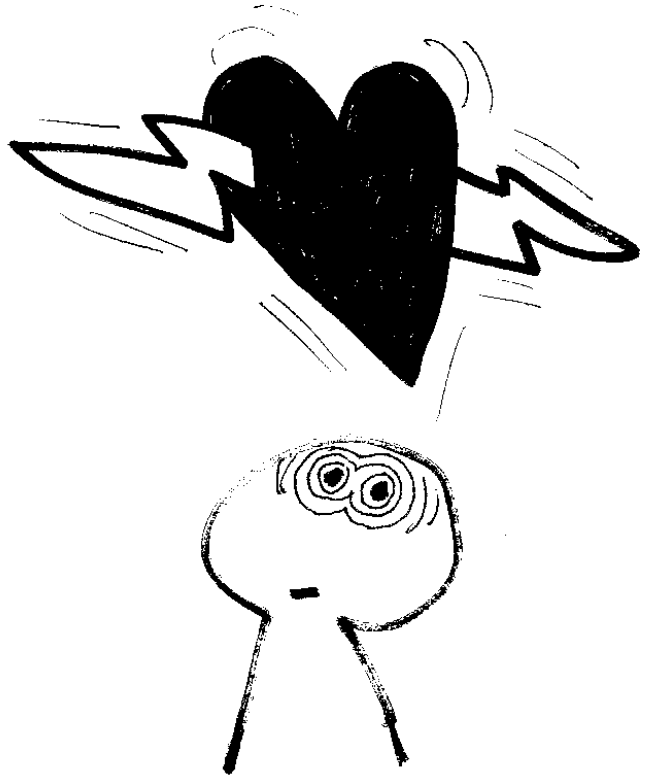

Patten: Alien Chronicles – first in a trilogy. Contest: see how far you can read into it before you see it's a rip-off of Exodus.

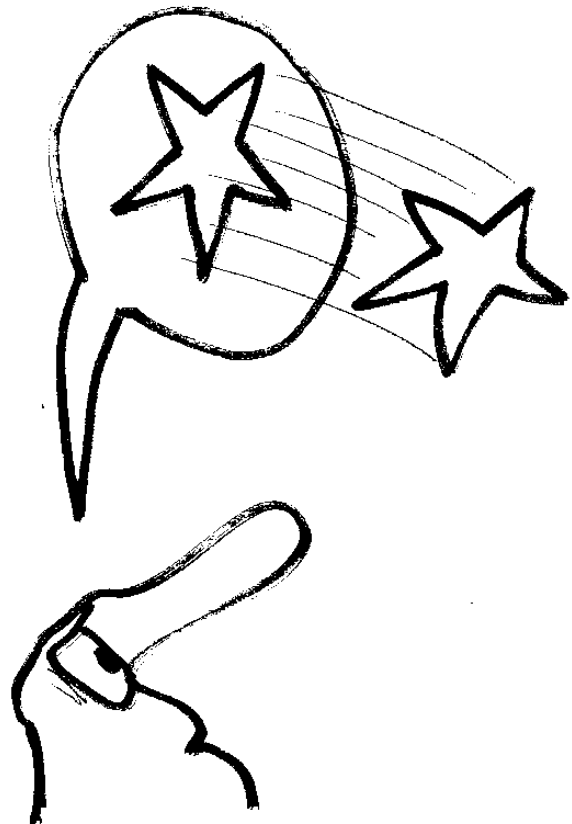
