The Japanese space agency is looking for their satellite. It was supposed to search for black holes, but is currently out of control. Other problems at Fukushima, which is still leaking radioactive water. They are trying to create an ice wall underground to contain this. It has never been done on this scale.

A Moment of Science, with David Okamura. SpaceX is launching again tomorrow, and then trying once more to land on the barge. Blue Horizon is doing better on the landings, but the first stage doesn't fly as high.

There is interesting sea life off the California coast. (*It is sometimes more interesting than the non-sea life on the California coast.* - ed) Whale watching boats were seeing basking sharks, rare in this area. 40' plankton eaters. On the east coast, shellfish gatherers had to come up with a new way of getting them, after hurricanes. Hurricane-proof buoys, with kelp below, then various shellfish below. Working better and more efficiently.

Scientists are warning about changing ocean chemistry, as the ocean becomes more acid, which is corrosive to shellfish shells, among other things. The West Antarctic ice shelf would raise the sea level by feet, not inches, if it breaks loose and melt.

The Great Barrier Reef is suffering a type of bleaching that can affect the live coral, and which is potentially fatal.

Every once in a while you hear about miracle gadgets producing free energy and the like. The University of Copenhagen announced a kind of reverse photosynthesis. Adding chlorophyll to certain types of fungi and exposing them to sunlight helps speed the breakdown of organic material into methanol in a laboratory setting. David wonders about whether this can work on cellulose, which is the real problem with bulk waste.

Matthew Tepper mentioned Reef Protection International, founded by Matthew's nephew.

Francis Hamit comments that there's a new sub-genre called Climate Lit.

Miscellaneous: David Okamura noted that 3D printers are not secure, because they produce a distinctive sound pattern as they create an object. A recording of that sound can be back-engineered. Francis Hamit points out that this is a subfield of intelligence work, and was first noticed on IBM Selectric typewriters.

Patron Saint Eliot [Elst] Weinstein [from the hagiography]: Elst invented a board game called *For This You Die* and invented the Hogu Banquet, an alternative to the Hugo Banquet and was held at McDonald's. Elst is said to be the LASFS member who most resembles Prof. Moriarty. He also created Herbangelism, a religion based on the comic book character Herbie, who is both fat and apparently indestructible. (*Elst also created the physical Chocolate Covered Manhole Cover based on a Larry Niven story. The CCMC is a fixture gift at LASFS' annual Gift Exchange.* - ed)

Guests: The Registrar introduced Shawn, a paramedic turned computer programmer. Shawn was inspired by the stories of Larry and Jerry to come to LASFS.

Announcements: This Saturday is Record Store Day, with special events at music stores.

Francis Hamit mentioned that this is the 80th anniversary of the first MFA program for writing, in Iowa.

WorldCon announced they had received 4,000 nominating ballots.

Jerry said that the *There Will Be War* series has been re-released in e-book form, and Castalia House offered to handle this. Their publisher has been campaigning to nominate Jerry as Best Editor, without letting him know.

National Space Society is giving Jerry the Heinlein Award at the Space Development Conference.

Committee reports: LOSCON 43 pass-ons are posted on the website now. The Chairman of the Board announced that there will be no May board meeting.

A Moment of Science, with David Okamura. SpaceX managed to land their Falcon first stage on a barge. They hope to launch that one again as early as July. It may be just a test shot, to see if the rocket really is re-usable. The plan is for each booster to last 10-20 missions, and eventually up to 100 flights. Previous landings have shown that interior hardware survives well, but there may be exterior damage.

It's big, it's orange, it's coming to L.A. The last space shuttle tank is on the way here. It may be here as early as May. This was the tank design for low orbits, and had

been used in the investigation of the Columbia disaster.

Stephen Hawking is now advocating a plan to send micro-probes via light sails to Alpha Centauri. Each probe less than an ounce. The question is, what would they look for, because there don't appear to be habitable planets there.

The Kepler probe shut down briefly, but is back online. We don't yet know why it shut down.

April 12th was the 55th anniversary of Yuri Gagarin's flight, and we have come quite a way.

The Long Beach Grand Prix is coming up, but ESPN is about to broadcast drone racing, the aerial kind. There are also submersible probes, mapping the topography of Loch Ness. One of them just found the prop version of the Loch Ness Monster, as well as some shipwrecks.

Jerry remarked that the earlier attempt at reusable rockets got up to 11 flights. Jeff Bezos is now advertising used spaceships for sale. ARPA is wanting something that can fly 10 times in 10 days. (*LASFS should buy one of the used spaceships so that we can hold our meetings in orbit - if we can get somebody to purchase our fuel for us.* - ed).

New Business: CLJ II proposal on e-book idea. Fundraising idea for LASFS, an e-book of contributions by Forry Award recipients. Even if we could get 1/3 of the winners, it could work as a concept. Would require work up front, and Charlie hopes that the contributors would be willing to let us do a reprint of an existing piece of writing for a royalty, but no upfront advance.

Reviews: Milt Stevens reviewed *The Grace of Kings*, a Nebula nominee. Well-crafted, but Milt didn't like the characters. Generic Asian world.

Josh read two Philip K. Dick novels, one the expanded version of the *Unteleported Man*, a mess but still worth reading. *Now Wait For Last Year* was more complete. A narcotic permits the user to go backwards or forwards in time, or sideways in reality.

Nick reviewed *The Werewolf of Ponkert* by H. Warner Munn, containing a pair of 1920s Weird Tales stories, written in response to a challenge from Lovecraft.

Jerry announced *The Little Word of Don Camillo* and sequel books are re-released in Kindle version, including some that were not previously translated into English.

Miscellaneous:

Francis Hamit hopes to start shooting the movie this fall, with a possible 2017 release. (*But what will Francis do if the movie shoots back?* - ed.)

Stan entered LASFS while going to USC and questioned fans for data on a college paper on "newly developing interpersonal relationships in fandom." Stan also invented some of the LASFS poker games and is credited with many of the first set of pictures for the fan gallery. CLJ II mentioned that Stan Burns was badly injured in an accident, and Bill Warren went out to visit him prior to his death.

Patron Saint Stan Burns was given Three Cheers and getting the last word with AGFA.

Patron Saints Len and June Moffatt: The Moffatti are Evans-Frehafer Award winners, TAFF winners, and Fan writers. They were co-guests of honor at the 1999 BoucherCon. At one time, they would bring young, impressionable fan into their home and civilize them. (*This did not always work. One of these (now former) youngsters considers me a Communist, obviously not able to tell the difference 'twixt a Communist and a Liberal.* - ed.)

June is a former LASFS secretary, as well as a former Board member. June first came to LASFS in 1947, and there were roughly 20 people there. Her escort wanted to introduce her to Forry, but he was busy talking to someone else, and couldn't be bothered. That was at the meeting place on Bixel St. Louise Leipar was the one who brought her. Louise ran a boarding house with fan renters and had been to LASFS before. Len was June's second husband. The main thing she got from the first one was three children. Both June and Len had first marriages that broke up, and they were friends. June went Len's apartment-warming, and they eventually became close, and finally got married. Len found that June could edit his fan writing, back in the days of stencils and typewriters.

Scratch: The Moffatts made a wonderful couple, and we still have the better half with us. Gavin: Len was one of the men who was with us from early on, and stayed with us in fandom for a very long time. Enjoyed listening to his stories of fandom.

The Patron Saints, Len and June Moffatt, were given Six Cheers and a magnifying lens.

Guests: There were no guests at this meeting.

Special Orders of Business:

Longtime fan Mistie Joyce died suddenly a few days ago due to ongoing ill health. LASFAPA was her last contact with fandom.

Treasurer's Report:

We have money, and can't spend it.

Committee reports: A Moment of Science, with David Okamura:

There was supposed to be a chance of precipitation, but that changed. Adios, El Nino, we barely knew you. Northern California got a lot of precipitation, but La Nina drought conditions may come5 in, with colder ocean currents causing rain to bypass our region. The Sierra Nevada snow pack still has not recovered, nor has the ground water. (*They should both take two aspirins and call a doctor in the morning.* ed.)

Everyone thought that the big asteroid impact wiped out the dinosaurs in one fell swoop, but it's more complex than that. It looks like dinosaurs were already in decline for as many as 50 million years before the asteroid impact. Possibly the effects of continental drift, changing environment and competing mammals all contributed, along with geothermal events. (*The geothermal events were the eruption of the Deccan Traps in southern India. According to Wikipedia, "The gases released in the process may have played a role in the Cretaceous-Tertiary extinction event, which included the extinction of the non-avian dinosaurs. The consensus among the scientific community is that the extinction was triggered by the Chicxulub impact event in Central America, but that the Deccan eruptions also damaged the world's environment." The eruptions lasted some 30,000 years.* - ed.)

Orbital ATK hasn't used any of their regular rockets for over a year now, but have been using United Space Alliance rockets. They are lobbying Congress to let them use old ICBM rockets for launches, which would require a change in long-established federal policy. The idea of publicly built rockets competing with privately built rockets is controversial, but we have some left without other purpose.

Good news, bad news. We may have a victory against a form of cancer, but it's because it is now considered a non-cancerous thyroid tumor variety.

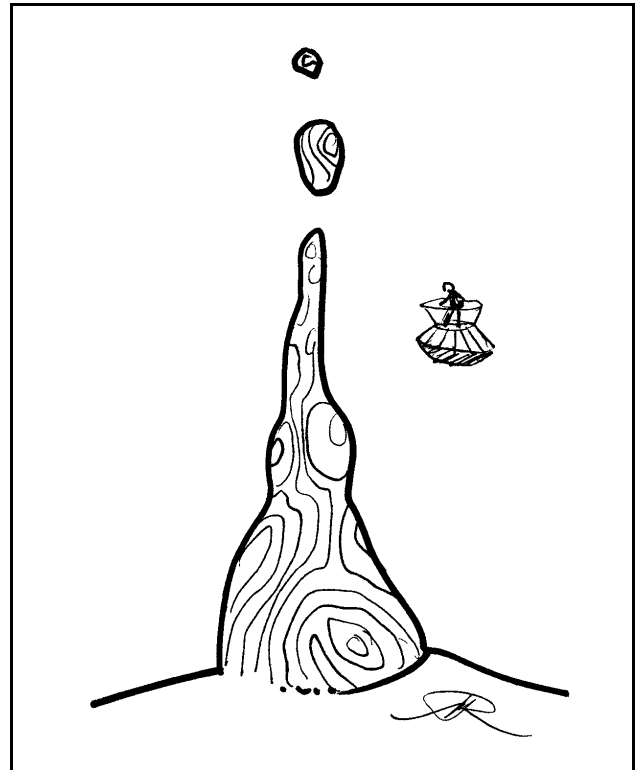
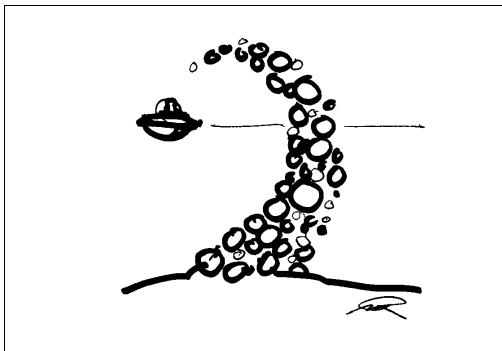
Gavin: Proposed some Standing Rules changes about LOSCON, in writing, but nothing was decided at this point.

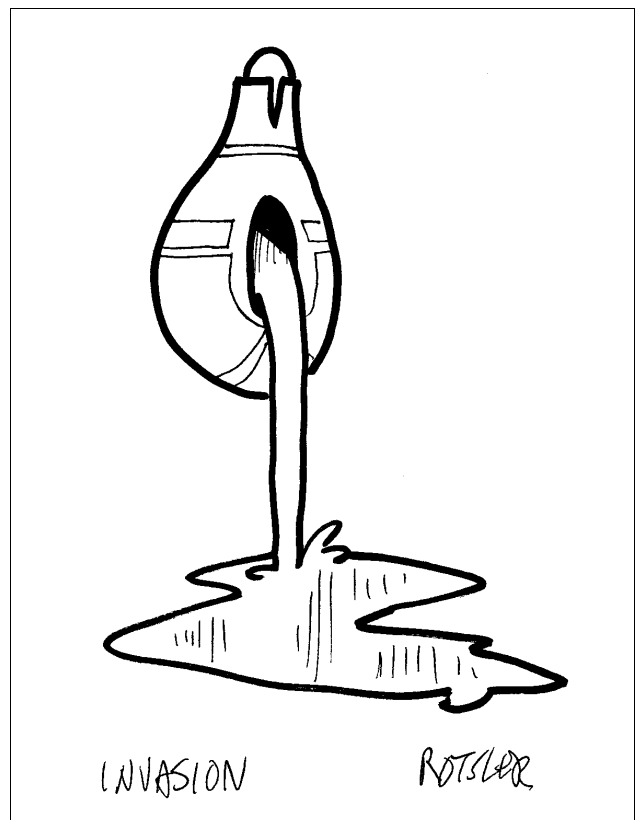
Friday night board gaming
