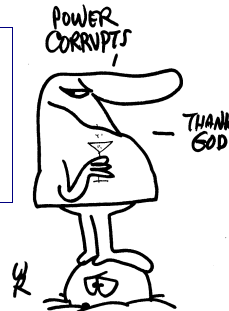

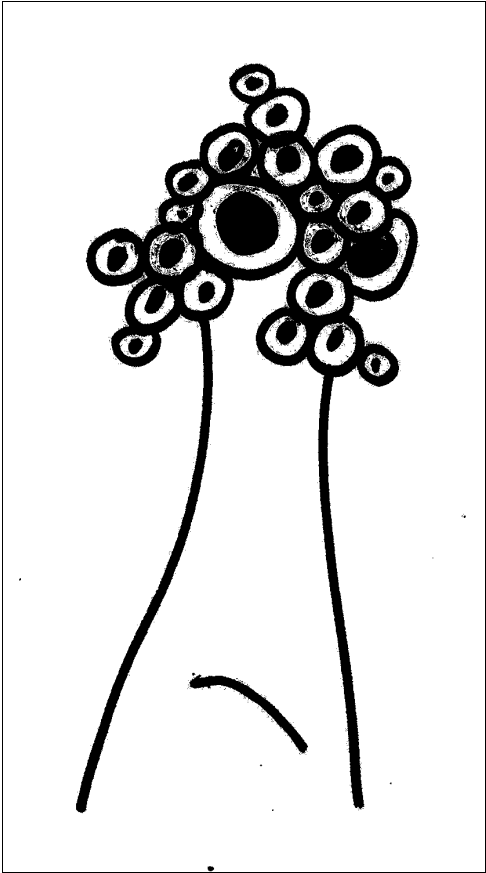

The next BoD meeting will be on August 13, 2017.

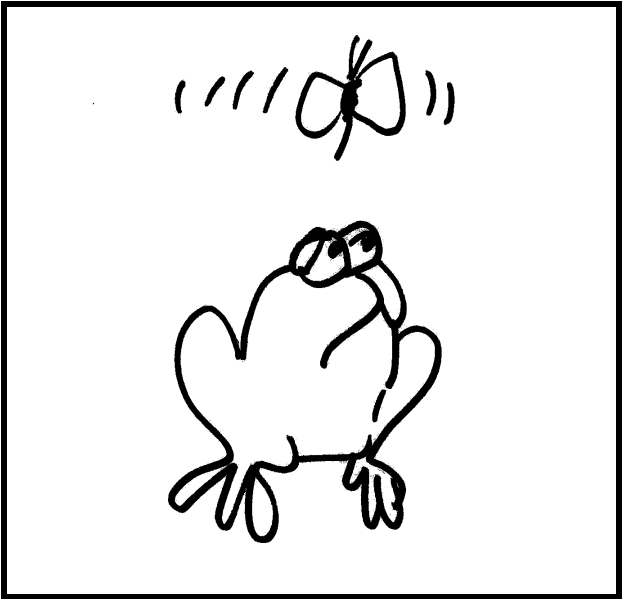

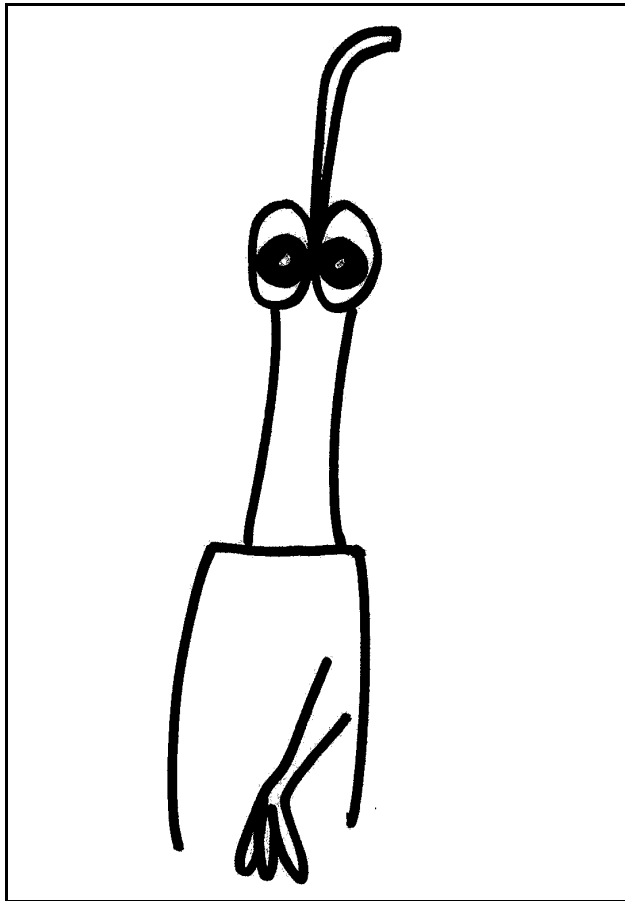

We shall move our gaming back to LASFS when the club moves into permanent quarters.

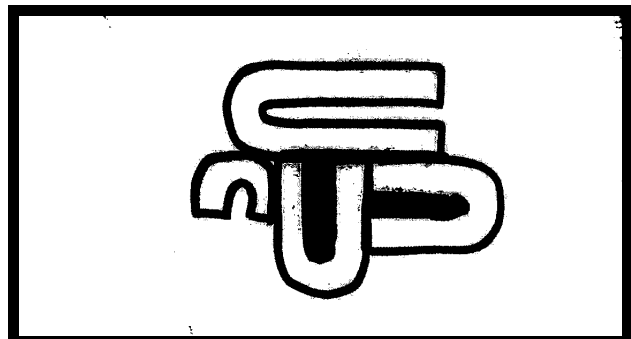
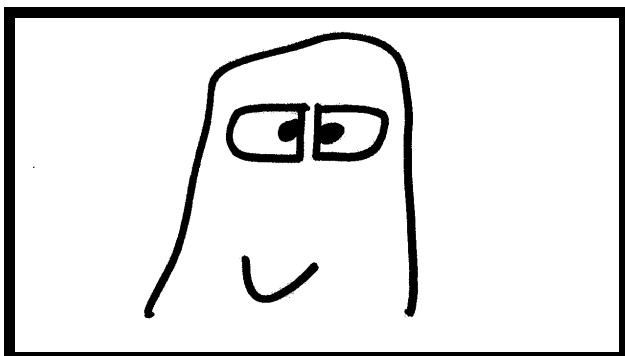
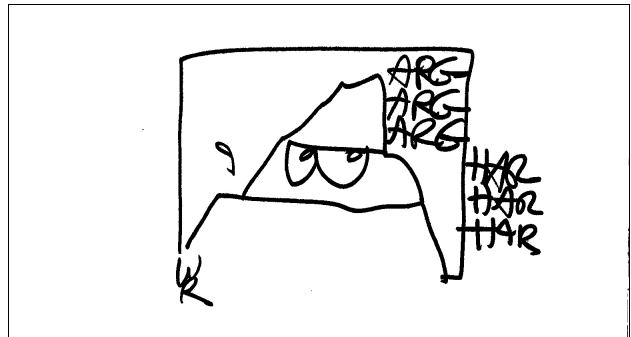
