**Meeting 4182, October 5, 2017
Vice President Matthew Tepper, presiding
Scribe Kristen Gorlitz, scribbling**

Remember, remember, the fifth of October, as Vice President Tepper calls LASFS meeting #4182 to order at 8:00 PM. (with a ketchup bottle) first meeting in a restaurant in a while Matthew Tepper thanked all for being here, at the strangest meeting since the Rodney King riots.

Special Orders of Business: Milt Stevens: Joe Zeff and Marcia Minsky had gone to pick up Milt for the LASFS meeting. He was not waiting. They went inside and found him "out of it." They took him to an ER in the area. They thought he was getting better, having only had pneumonia. At Kaiser, Woodland Hills, he had a heart attack and passed. At the pick-up, things didn't look normal. Normally he's in the garage, garage door up, and he's waiting. After two phone calls, he opened the door, Joe went in, and the only response he got to pounding on the door, and found the door open, and asking his condition was "Yeah" "OK."

They called 911. He was taken to Simi Valley Hospital, thence to Kaiser, and Monday morning at 4:09 he succumbed to a heart attack.

Dian Crayne: Email yesterday from Elayne Pelz. Dian Pelz Crayne has passed away. Bill Mills reports she had not shown up for her book club, so the police were called. On the second call, they were told to do a welfare check. She had passed, apparently peacefully, sitting in her chair. Dian was a published author, and first wife of Bruce Pelz. They had an amicable divorce party, which was the lead-in for the Larry Niven story, "What Can You

Say About Chocolate Covered Manhole Covers.' She then married Chuck Crayne and they moved to Willits, CA. Chuck died in 2009, and she moved into town from the outskirts. We had a long, long moment of silence.

Program Committee CLJII announced reminiscences of Milt and Dian. We have a couple of members who may have words about Jerry.

The **Menace** were read, corrected, and George McUrso bid \$1 to name the **Menace** "This Meeting was Called To Order with a Meatloaf." A motion to approve was seconded and passed.

Patron Saint: This week's **Patron Saint** is **Steve Bilan**. Steve's Sainthood was paid for with donations from Greg Bilan, his brother. **Patron Saint Wteve Bilan** was given Three rousing Cheers.

Announcements:

Skirball Center has an event, Francis Hamit is updating his knowledge of virtual reality. Unfortunately, Timothy Leary compared VR to LSD, and people have been Leary of the subject ever since.

Registrar Marty Cantor reported that we have no guests.

Reminiscences of Milt Stevens, Marty Cantor: Milt was a fine fan writer, unsung, but with a dry wit. He would write deconstructions of SF novels. He had a fanzine, *The Passing Parade*. In recent years, he didn't do it as much, but in the patio of the second clubhouse, he'd talk about interesting and funny things at the police department. He was a civilian employee, and got to know an awful lot of stuff. He did a lot of LOC writing, and when the news got out, two fan writers noted they had LOCs from him. He's been helping to find properties we might be able to use, and he had very good finds. Not quite what we could use, but still very close.

Matthew Tepper: Milt had been married at one time, to Beverly Styvers, and on marriage, changed to Sylvia Stevens, aka Contessa. Milt had a mordant wit and a sardonic worldview, possibly due to his employment. After the Sundance decision, it was ruled prisoners had to be given a meal with vitamin supplements. When asked what that stuff was we were supposed to give prisoners, he replied "Zyklon B". Then had to leap to explain it was a joke before the officer wrote it down.

Jerry Pournelle Interlude.Fraternity - Joe Zeff: two stories: Jerry was a state champion fencer in college. One evening, Jerry told the story: apparently when young, he was on a trip to Germany, and told some students in Heidelberg he was a fencer. He was invited to uphold the honor of the university. He found himself in a real Heidelberg duel. These are very ritualized. You have goggles to protect your eyes. And you swing and guard to someone reading poetry for the rhythm. He got a cut on his face, and got a cut on the other fencer's scalp. First aid: blood wiped up, disinfected with beer, bandaged with a black bandage. Since duels were forbidden, when asked

how the injury occurred, the approved reply was, "Sir, I was gored by a bull." At one Worldcon: he was walking back to the hotel with a walking stick he had bought in the huckster room. Two men shoved him into an alley and tried to rob him at knife point. He pulled the sword out of his brand new sword cane, and used Crocodile Dundee's line before Croc ever did.

Francis Hamit, a political opposite of Jerry. During the Iraq war, they found themselves in complete agreement that it was a bad idea. This was unsettling for both of them. Jerry somehow found out one of their computers was dying, and volunteered to build them one, so he could write a column about it.

Back to Milt: George McUrso at Corflu, talking about electric cars including Tesla. Always wondering how Musk managed this on account of Oil Company interference. Milt noted the first battery pack for a Tesla was made from laptop batteries. Oil Companies were trying to interfere with electric car batteries, but never thought to interfere with laptop batteries. Marc Schirmeister: Enjoyed Milt's company and sneaky sense of Humor. One story was of how a truck load of waterfowl were hijacked, calling it Grand Theft Duck. He also fixed a traffic ticket for him. One time, he found a copy of *Imagination* magazine from the 50s, and found a letter from Milt Stevens, and gave it to him. This was the first letter he'd ever published in an SF magazine.

Karl Lembke recalls Milt's suggestion about the true identity of Jack the Ripper. The killer had medical knowledge, and was someone who could approach women and gain their confidence even when there was a murder spree going on. One person who would fit this description is Florence Nightingale. Marcia Minsky: She was having car trouble last year, and looking for a newer car. Because her credit score was rather poor, she was bemoaning the fact. Milt asked for details, and said he'd sign for it. The salesman talked to Milt and traveled to take paperwork to Milt to sign, because of his limited mobility. CLJII:

When Ed Buchman was a regular contributor, CLJII would whip up covers for him. When people got tired of the old villains, he devised the epitome of evil league. Pelz, Miller, Stevens, Sue Fox. Milt is a cartoon character, which means he can't die. He's now in limbo until a new editor brings him back. Debra: Eylat wasn't able to be here, and has a story to pass along. "Milt was always a gentleman to me. He will be greatly missed. I'm sorry he's gone."

Chris Wilson: Joined LASFS at 15. Most remembers his gentlemanlyness, and talked to her when she was age 15 as an adult. He never talked down to her. She looked forward to seeing him again last week. Matthew Tepper: When I first met Milt, we didn't get along. This was due to a tiny little factor I was an obnoxious jerk teenager. Fortunately, I eventually gave the wisdom of respecting my elders and respecting people in general a chance, and over the last couple of decades, I feel Milt became a close friend, and in the last few years a member of our inner circle. I'm sure he was pleased when I finally tied the

knot, along with a number of very relieved single women. He was such a reliable reviewer, when Matthew called for reviews, he'd stare pointedly at Milt. Milt would feign a look of surprise, and then give a pointed, focused review of some insane movie he had seen. He had definite opinions about the Hugos, not thinking well of the Young Adult and Fan Hugo categories. He was well known and well regarded. Many who knew him only through fanzines spoke well of him. There were many tributes to him over Facebook. I feel devastated over the loss of a good friend and a good man.

Gavin Claypool: "Milt and Craig had gone to our local SF show, Hour 25, to talk about this upcoming event, LA 2000. I heard that show and showed up at the clubhouse the following Thursday. So Gavin's membership is Milt and Craig's fault. He chaired the first L5 conference with Jerry." Matthew inserted something about Dian Crayne.

Matthew's first con was at the LA Statler Hilton, 1968, FunCon. This existed because Donaho, Rogers, and Stark had bid for the 1968 Westercon and won. Then they won the 1968 Worldcon. They promised not to combine the two, but did anyway. Bruce and Dian Pelz put on a convention over that weekend on the West Coast. Harlan Ellison wrote an article about it. Matthew read it, and attended. He asked the first person he met if he knew where Larry Niven was. Well, you might ask that person over there. Tom Digby had pointed to Larry. Debra: Ben Levin relayed a message: He doesn't have anything particular to say Debra felt that Ben was also treated like a grown-up by Milt, even when he was a kid. Karl: "Milt was very generous. He paid for the sitting room furniture out of his own pocket. Same with the beverage set-up in LA Con IV fanzine lounge, including beverage fridge. Other things that are not my story to tell, and some embargoed." (Late note: Milt has donated enough to qualify for the highest level of donor recognition: Dark Universe -- \$11,000 and above.) John Hertz: At one point, Milt thought he'd be remembered only for his fan writing. That turns out to be the contribution for which he was the least acknowledged. He co-chaired a Worldcon, ran two fanzine lounges, including at LA Con IV. CLJII: We have observed what seems to be a flood of deaths.

Gavin: Dian story: We talked on Tom Digby's Saint Night about what can you say about chocolate covered manhole covers. The launch was the divorce party. There are a lot of married couples we don't see coming here, and we haven't seen Digby in quite a while. Rowan: Sad that Milt died, it was unexpected. She was referred to Milt for info on what it was like to work with criminals. He told stories of the people he worked with in the LAPD. He'll be dearly missed. Karl: If there is a Hell, he's being dealt in right now. Frank Waller once caught Milt in a conversation, and he treated Frank like a human being. After that, called him Uncle Miltie. Matthew Tepper tried calling him that once and it Ant-agonized him.

Greg Barrett: His thoughts are that Milt was somebody that, talking or silent, he brought something to a room -- a certain feeling that entirely Milt. The club will be different without him. CLJII: Milt had a certain anti-gravitas.

Barbara Harmon: Found that he was always very quiet, friendly, and respectful, and he had an endless amount of information about what he had read. There was a non-stop flow of book reviews once he got going. You got the sense he could have gone on forever. Hare: Many times when there were conversations going on, he was the one recognizing people and playing traffic cop. He was a perfect moderator for panels. Matthew: he was our secret weapon. Happy to see the outpouring of affection throughout fandom. Gavin: He was a true fan.

Miscellaneous:

Greg Barrett: Joanne Kaiser has reopened the book store. She needs help pricing books and going through stuff.

Marc Schirmeister: At a NASFIC, 1975-6, got his hands on the first Laser book. He read it to a crowd. Tom Monteleone wrote it. (Seeds of Change).

Joe Zeff had a putridity report. Joe takes a fair number of medicines, some of which cause drowsiness. On a new bottle of pills, "warning, may cause drowsiness, and this effect may be enhanced by alcohol or marijuana."

We moved to let staff put away the chairs and adjourn. The motion carried at 9:29 pm. And the chairs were presumably put away.
