Ashish: Ready player one, enjoyed, but not as good as the book.

Nick Smith: The movie has some of the cultural reference points, only done with digital animation. Overall, the book was better but this is still a fun adventure movie in many ways. digital animation of human avatars is well done. Worth watching for cheap. Good SF that was largely believable and visually stimulating.

Frank Waller: Expanse -- watching for a while, it was

choppy, and tended to repeat itself.

Nick: It's a grim, gritty near future SF story.

Karl: It's a good series, and quite enjoyable. The books are also quite good.

Ashish, lots of hard sf.

Nick: "Big Fish and Begonias", animated SF at Laemmle, soon moving to AMC and Landmark. This is a Chinese attempt at a Studio Ghibli style anime film. Part Chinese folklore, part "new Chinese folklore". The big fish is how they refer to oversized dolphins. Fascinating fantasy story.

This studio is not up to Ghibli's top line, but it's in the ballpark.

Francis Hamit: A bit of nostalgia: Saw Star Trek 50 years ago this week in Vietnam. It came in the form of 16 mm black and white prints, projected against white plywood. Companion piece was Mission Impossible. (especially since we had signed up for Mission Impossible and wound up in the typing pool.) (And the Secretary will disavow any knowledge of your actions.)

One night, the movies weren't delivered. Francis was assigned to go get the movie.

Karl Lembke: Writers of the Future 34

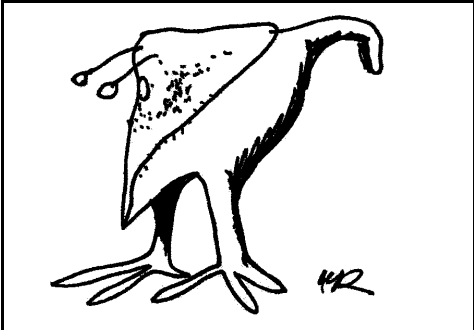
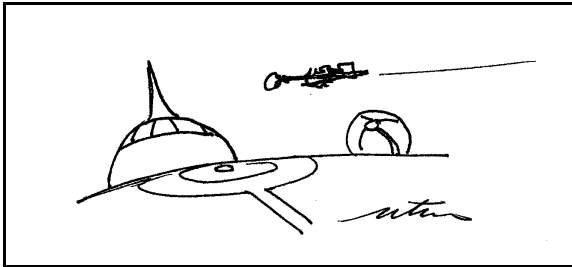

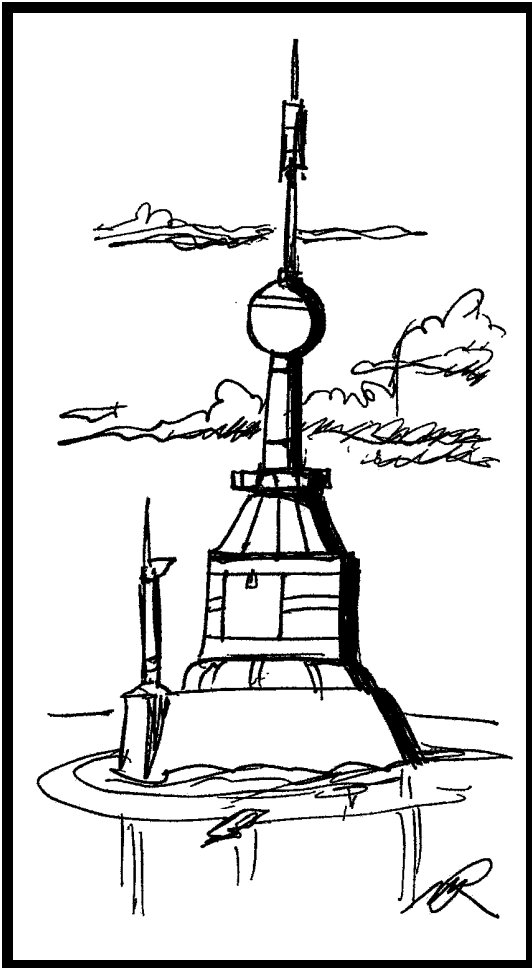
