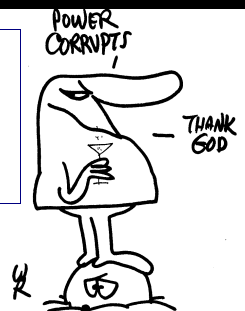

It was explained that moderators and staff should have an instruction sheet on how to handle problems. We discussed this problem thoroughly.

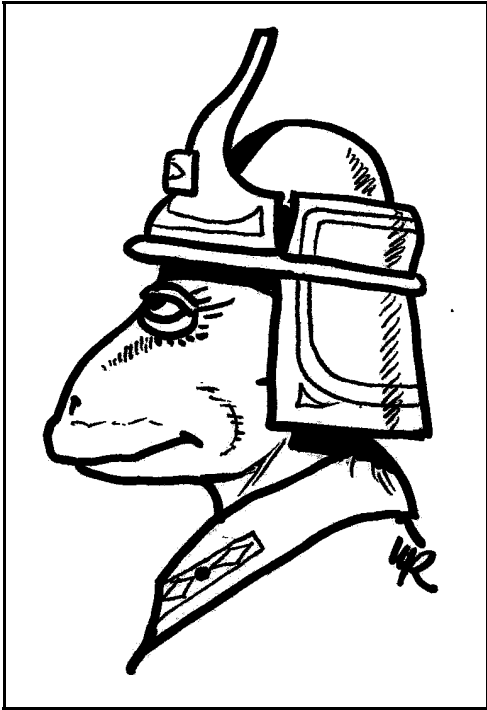

WEB MASTER (Barry Gold, Lee Gold): Gavin was thanked for typo corrections.

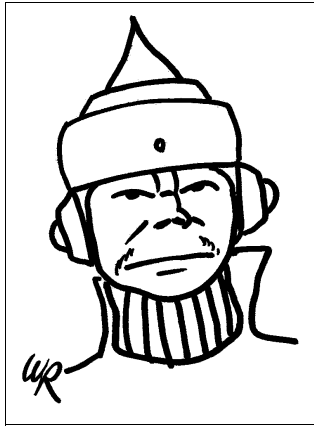
