Also wanted to ask if De Prof only used Rotsler art as a policy, or if others can play through?

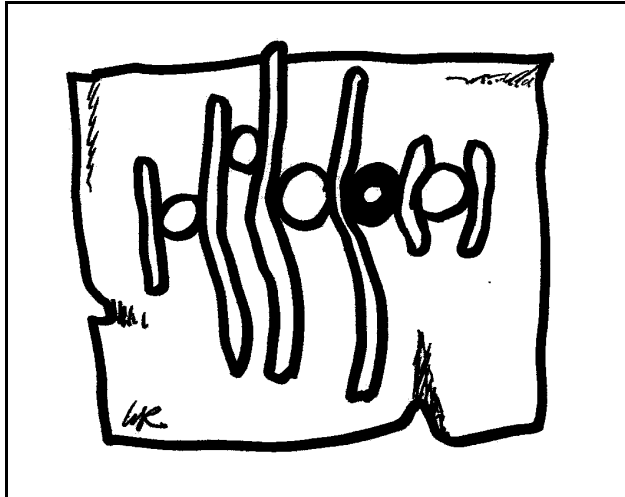

BOARD GAMING MEETUP

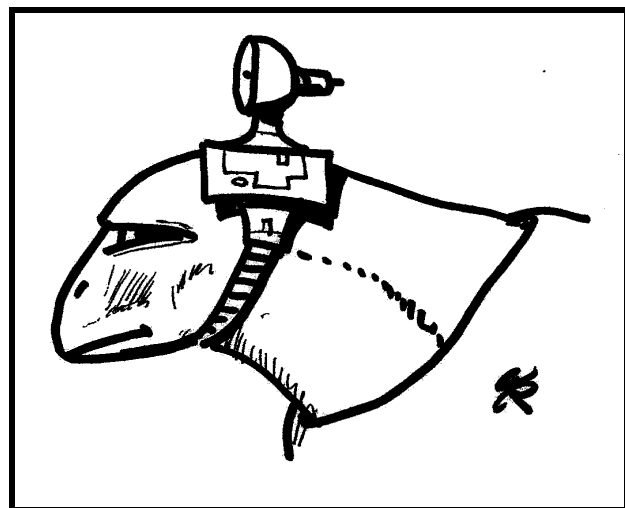

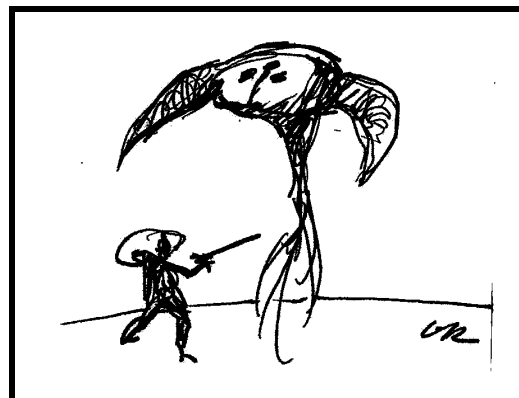
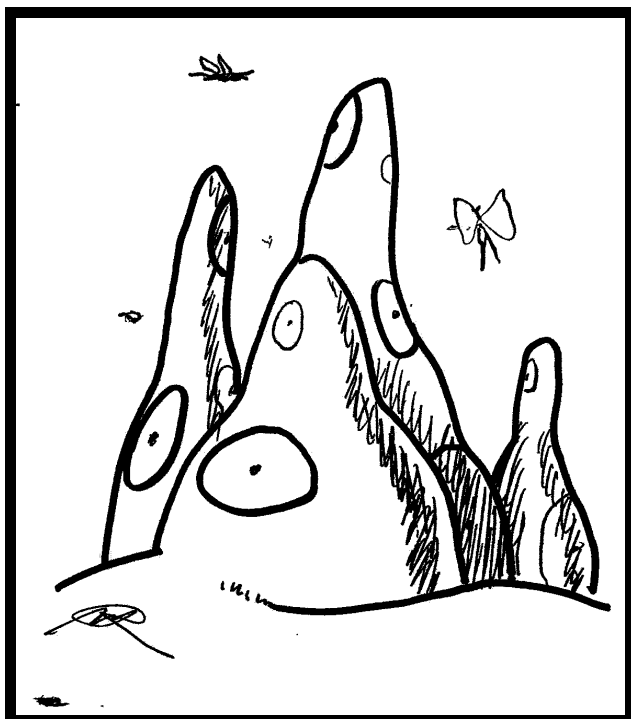
Our new hours are 3:00 pm to 10:00 pm.
