A couple of people are having terrible times with depression and isolation, so he's looking for uplifting stories, that will help people who are dealing with depression and bad news. So real escape literature.

Gizmo finished season 2 of *Altered Carbon* on Netflix. Very different from book series. There's also an animated series. It doesn't follow the books verbatim, but touches on the same points. Season felt a little better than season 2.

Tad Daily thinks Jim's idea is an awfully good one. If we come up with a good list in the next week, we could share it with the rest of the world.

Julia Ree: we can come up with our individual ideas. The libraries are still having online chat sessions. Don't forget your local librarians who are waiting to help.

Eylat notes the library has an awesome instant download facility. All you need is a library card. Plus, in April, if you have any library books due, LA Library is doing away with library fines.

Matthew has been reading *Blackout* and *All Clear*, two novels by Connie Willis. The characters are time travelers. In her future, time travel is completely owned by Oxford University. After this one, he plans to read *The Number of the Beast*, and *Ankara*, by Heinlein.




Our new hours are 3:00 pm to 10:00 pm.
